Violence Against Girl Children Picture from Secondary Data (Jan-Aug'21)

National Girl Child Advocacy Forum is a platform to combat the subjugation of girl children and women in Bangladesh. Started its activities in 2000 and has been working in organizational attitude since 2003, currently has 196 central members including National & International Organizations and some individual members. Its vision is to create a positive and protective environment for girl children and women increase opportunities for girls to grow into their full potential. And advocate for comprehensive policies which help to improve the living standards and rights of girls. Since its inception, NGCAF has been working to ensure establish the rights of girl children, so it's important to know the overall pictures of girls in order to conduct activities from the field level to the policy level.

In our country, many national and international organizations are working with children. Many of those organizations collect and publish data on violence against children. However, from all these data, we get a partial picture of girls, but in many cases, it's not possible to get an overall picture of girl children. Different national and local level magazines/newspapers have published report on child marriage and sexual abuse of girls at different times. But all those information can't be properly documented. No effective monitoring system has been developed at the local levels from national level. As a result, policy makers often do not give their attention to these issues and in many cases, it becomes difficult to conduct appropriate advocacy activities to take necessary action.

In order to lobby and advocacy at the policy level, it's necessary to bring out the overall picture of girlchildren. With this vision in mind, National Girl Child Advocacy Forum (NGCAF) has taken an initiative to collect violence/ abuse pictures against girlchildren from 24 dailies (08 Daily National Print, 02 Online & 14 Local Daily News Papers) since January 2021 to get an overall picture of Girl Children with the help of Members Organizations. Targeted age limit of girl children is up to 19 years. As part of preparation of the report, Secondary data has been collected by recruiting volunteers with funds provided by Educo Bangladesh, SDS and BRAC.

Through those collected information NGCAF will have taken advocacy activities at all levels. If necessary, will advocate for the amendment of existing laws, rules (additions, deductions) and enactment of new laws.

Below is the violence information for last 08 months based on the 24 Newspapers:

In the meantime, a press conference has been organized on September 30, 2021 on the January to August violence report, which has been circulated on 26 print medias and aired on a few TV channels.

As far as we know/ It's found that sexual violence against girl children is increasing in times of COVID-19. But sexual harassment news has been less published in the newspapers. I think it could be, Firstly- during the Covid period the movement of girls has decreased. As a result, sexual harassment in schools, colleges, roads and other places has become less. Secondly- due to the lockdown, the girls have been living with their relatives inside in the house, they have been harassed more by them, which has been reported less. Thirdly: Many people think that sexual harassment is not an extreme violence consequence like rape, the family has not made much fuss about it, because the family's honor will be ruined.

Recently rape has become a serious problem in our country. People from various quarters gathered to protest rapes across Bangladesh in recent weeks. During the movement, the Bangladesh government has adopted an amendment that would authorize the death penalty in rape cases. The ordinance will be recognized as Women and Children Repression Prevention (amendment) Ordinance -2020. According to the ordinance, 'Lifetime Rigorous Imprisonment' mentioned in Section 9(1) of the Act was replaced by 'Death or Lifetime Rigorous Punishment.' This means that rape is punishable by the death penalty or life imprisonment. Rape has not stopped, despite the death penalty being the maximum punishment. On the contrary, it's increasing day by day. Although we have a full law but the law enforcement is less, for this reason it's constantly increasing. During the news collection, we've found that even children under the age of 01 have been victims of crimes like rape and gang rape. The sad fact is that they were mostly being victimized by close relatives. These raped girls grow up in a lifelong trauma, unable to reach specific goals, which has a detrimental effect on society and the state.

From the collected data, we have found a total of 26 of domestic violence.



Corporal Punishment at Educational Institution: The same goes for the above, we know, the educational institutions were closed during lock down, but many girls were gone to madrasas or mosques to study Arabic, although the number is less now. In that case, 02 girls have been sexually harassed in religious educational institutions and 03 have been raped, which has been mentioned above.

We have received information about the Kidnapping and trafficking of a total of 147 girls in this category from the newspapers. Among them, many girls have been rescued and legal action has been taken in some cases. Note here that legal action means initial detention or case file.

We know, any disease outbreak affects women and men differently, but one trend is consistent - pandemics exacerbate the existing gender inequalities that women and girls face in their lives. For the horrendous increase in child marriage during Corona, Experts fear that child marriages can force girls to abandon school when the pandemic is finished, and they suggest immediate and effective action, including financial measures, to help families stop the practice. Although Academic activities have resumed across the country since last September 12 with the physical presence of students in educational institutions and the Education Ministry has recently said the government will kept trying to reach most targeted students through regular academic contact to prevent child marriage and possible dropout.

Finally, the above pictures of helplessness and persecution in the women and girls lives that has emerged here is the responsibility of the entire nation. We have to break the silence and unmask the family and society and it will be possible only through the responsibility of all of us including the state. And in order to continue this work, we need to continuously collect the pictures of violence against girls. By bringing up this picture we will be able to determine the issue of our advocacy. This will only be possible through the combined efforts of various like-minded organizations including NGCAF's member organizations. It's also better to mentioned that, the status of Girl Children report- 2021 will be published in next February or March.
